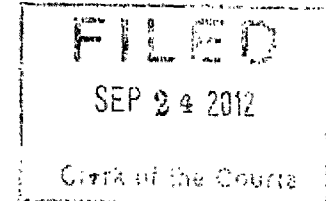

ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition to Transfer Attorney John E. Acuff, to disability inactive status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.2.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by Nile Remsing, N.P., the Court concludes that John E. Acuff is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the Court that:

1. The law license of John E. Acuff shall be transferred to disability inactive status nunc pro tunc to May 21, 2012, for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of this Court.
2. Mr. Acuff shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.6.
3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 21.4 and 21.5.
4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.2, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Acuff's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
5. Costs are taxed to John E. Acuff.
