DAVIDSON COUNTY LAWYER CENSURED

On October 25, 2016, Kahliel Robert Barlowe, an attorney licensed to practice law in Tennessee, received a Public Censure from the Board of Professional Responsibility of the Tennessee Supreme Court.

Mr. Barlowe's law license was administratively suspended on May 11, 2016. On May 31, 2016, while still suspended, Mr. Barlowe appeared in court in front of a judge, argued substantive issues on a case, and set the case for trial.

By these acts, Mr. Barlowe has violated Rule 5.5(a) (unauthorized practice of law) of the Rules of Professional Conduct and is hereby publicly censured for this violation. A public censure is a rebuke and warning to the attorney, but it does not affect the attorney's ability to practice law.

PUBLIC CENSURE

The above complaints were filed against Kahlial Robert Barlowe, an attorney licensed to practice law in Tennessee, alleging certain acts of misconduct. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, the Board of Professional Responsibility considered these matters at its meeting on September 9, 2016.

Mr. Barlowe's law license was administratively suspended on May 11, 2016, for failure to pay annual fees and to comply with IOLTA reporting. On May 23, 2016, Respondent informed three judges of his administrative suspension. On May 31, 2016, while still suspended, Respondent appeared in court in front of another judge, argued substantive issues on the case, and set the case for trial.

By the aforementioned acts, Mr. Barlowe has violated Rule 5.5(a) (unauthorized practice of law) of the Rules of Professional Conduct and is hereby publicly censured for this violation.
