ORDER OF ENFORCEMENT


This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Discipline filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board") against Respondent, Douglas R. Dadisman, on July 11, 2007, alleging that Respondent failed to act with reasonable diligence and promptness in representing a client and failed to communicate with a client; upon a Conditional Guilty Plea submitted by Respondent on April 28, 2008, in which Respondent admits failing to return the telephone calls of a client but states that such failure occurred at a time when Respondent was caring for his terminally ill father and dealing with his father's death; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which the Court approves Respondent's Conditional Guilty Plea and concludes that public censure is appropriate in this case.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 4.4 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Respondent is hereby publicly censured.
2. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Respondent shall pay to the Board the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$1,396.05, and in addition, shall pay the clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.
3. The Board shall cause notice of this public censure to be published as required by Rule 9, § 18.10 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
