**ORDER**

On November 21, 2007, Respondent, John Louis Dolan, Jr., was temporarily suspended from the practice of law pursuant to Rule 9, § 4.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court for his failure to respond to a complaint of misconduct. On June 23, 2008, Respondent filed a Petition for Dissolution of Order of Temporary Suspension and the petition was referred to a hearing panel pursuant to Section 4.3; On August 7, 2008, the Hearing Panel filed its Report and Recommendation in which it unanimously recommended that Respondent's temporary suspension be dissolved.

From all of which the Court adopts the recommendation of the Hearing Panel that Respondent's temporary suspension should be dissolved and grants Respondent's petition.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Respondent's temporary suspension is hereby dissolved and Respondent is permitted to resume the practice of law.
2. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Respondent shall pay to the Board of Professional Responsibility the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$245.00, and in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue, if necessary.
