ORDER OF TRANSFER TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Discipline or in the Alternative for a Transfer to Disability Inactive Status filed on August 24, 2006; upon a Conditional Guilty Plea filed on June 22, 2006; upon a Joint Petition for Transfer to Disability Inactive Status filed on June 22, 2006; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which the Court finds that Craig J. Donaldson is incapacitated from continuing to practice law and should be transferred to disability inactive status.

The Court further finds that the Conditional Guilty Plea has been approved by a Hearing Panel and by the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board") and should be approved and adopted as the Court's order.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that:

- 1. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 21.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Craig J. Donaldson is hereby transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period and until further order of this Court;
 - 2. The Conditional Guilty Plea filed herein is approved and adopted as the Court's order;
- 3. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 25.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, this Order shall become a public record upon filing; however, all other documents relating to this disability proceeding shall not become public records and shall be kept confidential;
- 4. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Respondent shall pay to the Board the expenses and costs of this matter in the sum of \$414.25, plus any costs assessed by the Clerk of this Court, for all of which execution may issue, if necessary; and

5. The Board shall cause notice of this transfer to disability inactive status to be published as required by Rule 9, § 21.4 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
