**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO  
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon a petition to transfer Harvey Randolph Fallin to disability inactive status filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.4.

Upon due consideration of correspondence and medical records provided to the Board by Mr. Fallin, the Court concludes that Harvey Randolph Fallin currently suffers from a disability by reason of medical infirmity or illness, which disability makes it impossible for him to continue to practice law and respond to or defend against pending disciplinary action File 101765-2026-1-MH-INV.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Harvey Randolph Fallin shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of this Court.
2. All pending disciplinary matters are suspended indefinitely until such time as Mr. Fallin is removed from disability inactive status.
3. Mr. Fallin shall comply with Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 in all respects and particularly as provided in Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 28, regarding the responsibilities of attorneys transferred to disability inactive status.
4. Mr. Fallin shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.
5. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.

6. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Fallin's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
