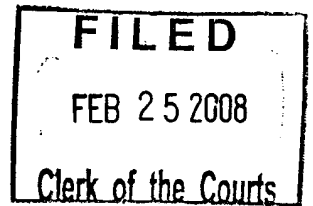


ORDER OF TRANSFER TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition for Transfer to Disability Inactive Status of George Lane Foster filed by Disciplinary Counsel pursuant to Rule 9, § 21.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court. The Board of Professional Responsibility asserts that due to mental infirmity or illness, George Lane Foster is incapacitated from continuing to practice law. Evidence of George Lane Foster's condition has been provided as exhibits to the Petition.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT:

- (1) That pursuant to Rule 9, § 21.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, George Lane Foster's license to practice law is hereby transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period and until further order of this Court.
- (2) That pursuant to Rule 9, § 25.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, this Order shall become a public record upon filing; however, all other documents relating to this disability proceeding shall not become public records and shall be kept confidential.
- (3) The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this transfer to disability inactive status to be published as required by Rule 9, § 21.4 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
