PUBLIC CENSURE

The above complaint was filed against William Ray Glasgow, an attorney licensed to

practice law in Tennessee, alleging certain acts of misconduct. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9,

the Board of Professional Responsibility considered these matters at its meeting on March 8, 2024.

Mr. Glasgow filed a lawsuit on behalf of a client against a sitting judge. The lawsuit was

filed shortly before a judicial election for the sitting judge's position, where Mr. Glasgow was also

a candidate. The lawsuit lacked any meritorious basis in fact or law and was filed solely to

advance Mr. Glasgow's position in the upcoming judicial election. The lawsuit contained a false

or reckless statement that the sitting judge had engaged in "constructive kidnapping" of a minor

child with "willful and deliberate malice and intent" while presiding over a dependent and neglect

proceeding.

By these acts, Mr. Glasgow has violated Rules of Professional Conduct 1.1 (competence),

1.3 (diligence), 3.1 (meritorious claims), 4.4(a)(1) (respect for the rights of third persons), 8.2(a)

(judicial and legal officials), and 8.4(d) (conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice) and

is hereby Publicly Censured for these violations.
