ORDER OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

This matter is before the Court on a Petition of the Board of Professional Responsibility of the Supreme Court of Tennessee (the Board), by and through Disciplinary Counsel, for the temporary suspension of John Douglas Godbee from the practice of law, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 4.3. The Petition has been authorized by the Chair of the Board of Professional Responsibility and is supported by the affidavit of Ted Rice, Deputy Director of Tennessee Lawyers Assistance Program.

Based upon the Petition and the supporting Affidavit, the Court finds that John Douglas Godbee poses a threat of substantial harm to the public.

By Order entered August 6, 2012, in No. M2012-01588-SC-BPR-BP, John Douglas Godbee was temporarily suspended from the practice of law.

It is therefore, ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the Court that:

- 1. John Douglas Godbee is hereby temporarily suspended from the practice of law as provided in Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 4.3. Mr. Godbee's temporary suspension of August 6, 2012 remains in full force and effect.
- 2. John Douglas Godbee shall comply with Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9 in all respects, and particularly as provided in Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 18.
- 3. John Douglas Godbee may make application for dissolution or modification of this Order as provided in Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 4.3.
- 4. The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this suspension of John Douglas Godbee to be published as required by Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 18.10.
