

ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition to Transfer Attorney Jay Grytdahl, to disability inactive status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 21.2, filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by Angela D. Watson, D.O., the Court concludes that Jay L. Grytdahl is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that:

- 1. The law license of Jay L. Grytdahl shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
- 2. Mr. Grytdahl shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 21.6.
- 3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 §§ 21.4 and 21.5.
- 4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9 § 25.2, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Grytdahl's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
