DAVIDSON COUNTY LAWYER SUSPENDED

On August 13, 2015, the Supreme Court of Tennessee suspended the law license of William Caldwell Hancock for one (1) year and ordered Mr. Hancock to pay restitution in the total amount of \$22,126.00. Mr. Hancock is also ordered to pay costs of the disciplinary proceeding to the Board of Professional Responsibility and to the Court.

The Board of Professional Responsibility filed a Petition for Discipline against Mr. Hancock containing allegations of ethical misconduct arising from Mr. Hancock's pursuit of a frivolous lawsuit. A hearing panel determined that Mr. Hancock made allegations in the suit that were not based upon a reasonable inquiry into the law or facts of the matter. The hearing panel further concluded that the purpose of the lawsuit filed by Mr. Hancock was to embarrass and burden a third person. The opposing party expended approximately \$20,000 to defend the suit, which included pursuit of sanctions against Mr. Hancock and his client. Mr. Hancock appealed the decision of the hearing panel to the Davidson County Chancery Court. The Chancery Court affirmed the hearing panel's decision.

Mr. Hancock has violated Rules of Professional Conduct 3.1, Meritorious Claims and Contentions; 4.4(a), Respect for the Rights of Third Persons; and 8.4(a) and (d), Misconduct.

Mr. Hancock must comply with Tenn. Supreme Court Rule 9, Sections 18 (2006) and 30.4 (2014), regarding the obligations and responsibilities of suspended attorneys and the procedure for reinstatement.
