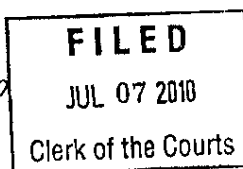

ORDER OF ENFORCEMENT

This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Discipline filed on June 24, 2008, by the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board"); and upon a Supplemental Petition for Discipline filed on July 15, 2008; upon a hearing held on March 17-18, 2010; upon Judgment of the Hearing Panel entered on April 19, 2010, upon an Order Amending Judgment filed May 7, 2010, upon Respondent's written decision not to appeal; upon the approval of the Board given June 11, 2010; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which it appears to the Court that the Judgment of the Hearing Panel imposing public censure, restitution to Complainants totaling \$6,379.34 and a thirty (30) day suspension is appropriate.

It is therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED** by the Court that:

1. As to the allegations of the original petition, Respondent, Fred T. Hanzelik, be and is hereby censured and Ordered to pay restitution to the Complainants in Board of Professional Responsibility File No. 30750-3(C)-JV in the amount of \$6,379.34.
2. As to the allegations of the supplemental petition, Respondent, Fred T. Hanzelik, is hereby suspended from the practice of law for thirty (30) days.
3. The suspension shall become effective ten (10) days after the filing of this Order.
4. Respondent shall comply in all aspects with Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 18 regarding the obligations and responsibilities of suspended attorneys.
5. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 24.3, the Respondent shall pay to the Board of Professional Responsibility the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$12,477.99 and in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs

incurred herein, within ninety (90) days from the entry of this Order, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.

6. The Board shall cause notice of this suspension to be published as required by Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 18.10.
