ORDER OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

This matter is before the Court on a Petition of the Board of Professional Responsibility of the Supreme Court of Tennessee, by and through Disciplinary Counsel, for the temporary suspension of James A. Hewitt from the practice of law, pursuant to Section 4.3 of Supreme Court Rule 9. The Petition has been authorized by the Chair of the Board of Professional Responsibility and is supported by the Affidavit of Matthew Loughney and the July 29, 2011 Order of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Tennessee, Nashville Division.

Based upon the Petition, the Affidavit of Matthew Loughney and the July 29, 2011 Order of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Tennessee, Nashville Division, the Court finds that James A. Hewitt poses a threat of substantial harm to the public.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged, and decreed by the Court that:

- 1. James a. Hewitt is hereby temporarily suspended from the practice of law as provided in Section 4.3 of Supreme Court Rule 9.
- 2. James A. Hewitt shall comply with Supreme Court Rule 9 in all respects, and particularly as provided in Section 18.
- 3. James A. Hewitt may make application for dissolution or modification of this Order as provided in Supreme Court Rule 9.

4. The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this suspension of James A. Hewitt to be published as required by Supreme Court Rule 9.
