DAVIDSON COUNTY LAWYER REINSTATED

By Order of the Tennessee Supreme Court entered July 14, 2020, Newton S. Holiday was reinstated to the active practice of law.

On June 9, 2020, the Board filed a Petition for Temporary Suspension based upon the failure of Mr. Holiday to respond to the Board's request for information, and Mr. Holiday was suspended by the Tennessee Supreme Court by Order entered June 18, 2020. Subsequent thereto, Mr. Holiday provided an appropriate response to the Board and on July 10, 2020, filed a Motion to Set Aside Order of Temporary Suspension. The Board filed a Response on July 13, 2020, acknowledging the sufficiency of Mr. Holiday's response and no objection to his motion.

ORDER DISSOLVING TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition for Temporary Suspension pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 12.3, filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility on June 9, 2020. On June 18, 2020, an Order of Temporary Suspension was entered based upon Newton S. Holiday's failure to respond to the Board. On July 10, 2020, Mr. Holiday filed a "Motion to Set Aside Order of Temporary Suspension." On July 13, 2020, the Board filed a response with this Court stating that the Board construes the motion as a petition for dissolution and does not oppose dissolution, based on Mr. Holiday's responses beginning on June 18, 2020.

Thus, the Court also construes the motion as a petition for dissolution and finds it appropriate to dissolve the temporary suspension at this time.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT:

1. The temporary suspension imposed upon Newton S. Holiday by Order of Temporary Suspension entered June 18, 2020, is hereby dissolved.
2. The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this reinstatement to be published as required by Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 28.11.
