**SULLIVAN COUNTY LAWYER PLACED ON DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

By Order of the Tennessee Supreme Court entered July 28, 2016, the law license of Wendal Douglas Jackson was transferred to disability inactive status pursuant to Section 27.3 of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9.

Mr. Jackson cannot practice law while on disability inactive status. He may return to the practice of law after reinstatement by the Tennessee Supreme Court upon showing of clear and convincing evidence that the disability has been removed and he is fit to resume the practice of law.

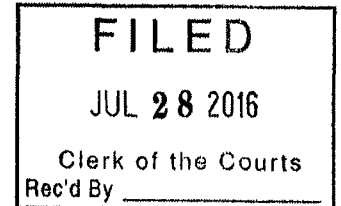
On June 17, 2016, the Supreme Court of Tennessee temporarily suspended Mr. Jackson from the practice of law upon finding that Mr. Jackson poses a substantial threat of harm to the public, pursuant to Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 12.3. That suspension remains in effect.

**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO  
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon a petition to transfer Wendal Douglas Jackson to disability inactive status filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.3.

Upon due consideration of documentation from J. Sidney Alexander, M.D., the Court concludes that Wendal Douglas Jackson is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Wendal Douglas Jackson shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
2. Mr. Jackson shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.
3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.
4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Jackson's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
