MADISON COUNTY LAWYER REINSTATED

On April 13, 2015, the Supreme Court of Tennessee reinstated Angela Jenkins-Hines to the practice of law. Ms. Jenkins-Hines was suspended from the practice of law by Order of the Court on January 23, 2015, for a period of one (1) year, with sixty (60) days to be served on active suspension and the remainder to be served on probation subject to certain conditions set forth in the Order of Enforcement. Ms. Jenkins-Hines will begin her probationary period upon reinstatement to the active practice of law.

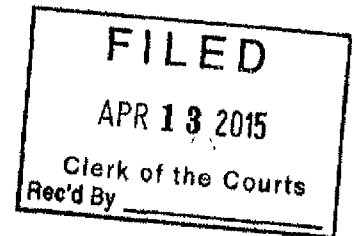
On March 12, 2015, Ms. Jenkins-Hines filed a Petition for Reinstatement to the practice of law. Pursuant to Tennessee Supreme Court, Rule 9, Section 30.4(e), the Board verified that the conditions required for reinstatement were satisfied and filed a Notice of Submission with the Supreme Court indicating Ms. Jenkins-Hines was eligible for reinstatement to the practice of law. The Order of Reinstatement entered April 13, 2015, was effective upon filing.

ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This matter is before the Court, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 30.4(c), upon a Petition for Reinstatement filed on March 12, 2015, by the Petitioner, Angela Jenkins-Hines. Ms. Jenkins-Hines was suspended from the practice of law by Order of this Court on January 23, 2015, for a period of one (1) year, consisting of sixty (60) days active suspension and the remainder on probation. A Notice of Submission was filed by the Chief Disciplinary Counsel indicating that the petition is satisfactory to the Board and that Ms. Jenkins-Hines has satisfied all conditions set forth in the Order imposing discipline and that she is eligible for reinstatement.

From all of which the Court grants the Petition for Reinstatement.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT:

1. The Petitioner, Angela Jenkins-Hines, is hereby reinstated to the practice of law in the State of Tennessee pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 30.4(c).
2. Ms. Jenkins-Hines shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein within ninety (90) days of the entry of this Order, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.
3. The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this reinstatement to be published as required by Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 28.11.
