

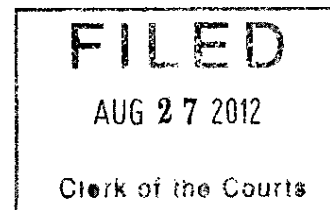

**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition to Transfer Attorney James Edwin Kissel to disability inactive status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.2.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by James Edwin Kissel, the Court concludes that James Edwin Kissel is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that:

1. The law license of James Edwin Kissel shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
2. James Edwin Kissel shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.6.
3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 21.4 and 21.5.
4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.2, documents other than this Order relating to James Edwin Kissel's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
5. Costs are taxed to James Edwin Kissel.
