

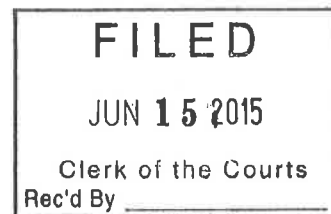

**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO  
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon a Joint Petition for Transfer to Disability Inactive Status filed by Gayle A. Lattimore and Arthur C. Grisham and upon the Response submitted by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.3 noting no objection to the transfer of Ms. Lattimore's law license to disability inactive status.

Upon due consideration of documentation from Ms. Lattimore's medical care provider, the Court concludes that Gayle A. Lattimore is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Gayle A. Lattimore shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
2. Ms. Lattimore shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.
3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.
4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Ms. Lattimore's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
