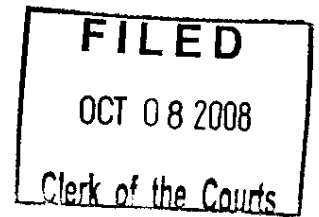

ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT

This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Reinstatement filed by Petitioner, Kathy A. Leslie, on April 28, 2008; upon a hearing before a Hearing Panel of the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board") on August 29, 2008; upon the Ruling and Recommendation of the Hearing Panel filed on September 22, 2008; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which the Court finds, pursuant to Rule 9, Section 19.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, that Petitioner has demonstrated by clear and convincing evidence that she has the moral qualifications, competency and learning in law required for admission to practice law in this state and that her resumption of the practice of law within this state will not be detrimental to the integrity or standing of the bar or the administration of justice, or subversive to the public interest.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Upon Petitioner's payment of the full amount of the Board's costs in the amount of \$253.74, as required by Rule 9, Section 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Petitioner is reinstated to the practice of law.
2. Petitioner shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue, if necessary.
3. The Board shall cause notice of this reinstatement to be published.
