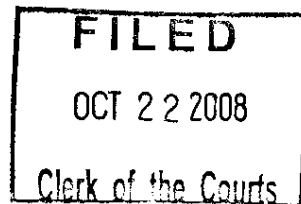

ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT


This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Dissolution of Order of Temporary Suspension filed by Petitioner, Michael Joseph Mahn, on September 26, 2008, pursuant to Rule 9, Section 4.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court. On September 22, 2008, Petitioner was temporarily suspended from the practice of law pursuant to Section 4.3 for his failure to respond to a complaint of misconduct. On October 14, 2008, a hearing was conducted before a Hearing Panel of the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board"), and on October 20, 2008, the Hearing Panel filed its Report and Recommendation, recommending that Petitioner's temporary suspension be dissolved.

From all of which the Court approves the Report and Recommendation of the Hearing Panel recommending that Petitioner's temporary suspension be dissolved.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** by the Court that:

1. The Petition for Dissolution of Order of Temporary Suspension filed by Petitioner is hereby granted, and Petitioner is reinstated to the practice of law upon Petitioner's payment of the full amount of the Board's costs in the amount of \$125.49, as required by Rule 9, Section 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
2. Petitioner shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue, if necessary.
3. The Board shall cause notice of this reinstatement to be published by the method outlined in Rule 9, Section 18.10 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
