ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon a petition to transfer Bryan Bradley Martin to disability inactive status filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.2.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by Joseph K. Reid II, PA-C, the Court concludes that Bryan Bradley Martin is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that:

- 1. The law license of Bryan Bradley Martin shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
- 2. Mr. Martin shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.6.
- 3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 21.4 and 21.5.
- 4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.2, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Martin's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
