ORDER

William T. Maxwell, Jr. was transferred to disability inactive status by order of the Court entered April 1, 2010. Mr. Maxwell filed a "Petition for Dissolution of Disability Inactive Status" on June 19, 2012, which the Court treats as a petition for reinstatement pursuant to Tenn. Sup Ct. R. 9, § 21.6. The Board of Professional Responsibility has filed a response in which it states that it has no objection to Mr. Maxwell's reinstatement, but requests that, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.6, the order of reinstatement require that all disciplinary complaints against Mr. Maxwell must be resolved prior to the effective date of his reinstatement. The Court finds that the Board's request is well-taken.

It is therefore ordered that Mr. Maxwell's petition for reinstatement is granted. Mr. Maxwell's reinstatement, however, shall not be effective until such time as all disciplinary complaints filed against him, whether prior to or subsequent to his transfer to disability inactive status, have been resolved.
