FLORIDA LAWYER DISBARRED

On September 22, 2015, the Supreme Court of Tennessee entered an Order of Reciprocal Discipline disbaring Brenda Lee McCann, of St. Augustine, Florida. Ms. McCann was licensed to practice law in Tennessee, Alabama and Florida. Ms. McCann was disbarred by the Supreme Court of Alabama by Order entered April 24, 2015.

Upon receipt of an Order of the Supreme Court of Florida dated October 30, 2014, approving disciplinary revocation and permanently revoking Ms. McCann's license to practice law in Florida, the Board of Professional Responsibility, pursuant to Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 25.4, filed a Notice of Submission on April 15, 2015.

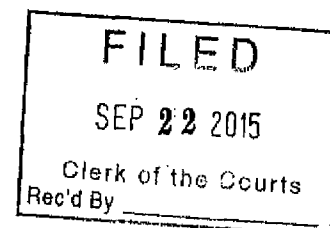
Ms. McCann must comply with Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9 Sections 28 and 30.4 (2014) regarding the obligations and responsibilities of disbarred attorneys. The Order of Reciprocal Discipline is effective upon entry.

ORDER OF RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE

This matter is before the Court pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25, upon a Notice of Submission filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility (“Board”) consisting of a certified copy of an order of disciplinary revocation entered by the State of Florida on October 30, 2014.

On July 24, 2015, this Court entered a Notice of Reciprocal Discipline requiring Ms. McCann to show cause, if any, why reciprocal discipline should not be imposed in Tennessee. The order entered by the State of Florida on October 30, 2014 imposed a disciplinary revocation, which the order described as “tantamount to disbarment.” Ms. McCann filed a Response to the Notice of Reciprocal Discipline on August 17, 2015. On August 28, 2015, the Board filed a Reply to Ms. McCann’s Response. Finally, Ms. McCann filed a “Response to Reply” on September 8, 2015.

After careful and full consideration of the entire record, the Court finds, based upon the particular facts of this case, that none of the elements in Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.4 exist. As a result, it is appropriate to enter an Order of Reciprocal Discipline.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

- (1) Brenda Lee McCann is disbarred, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 12.1 (2014) and Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.4 (2014).
- (2) Additionally, Ms. McCann shall comply in all respects with Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 28 (2014) and 30.4 (2014) regarding the obligations and responsibilities of disbarred attorneys and the procedure for reinstatement.
- (3) Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 28.1 (2014), this Order shall be effective upon entry.

(4) The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this disbarment to be published in accordance with Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 28.11.
