PUBLIC CENSURE

The above complaint was filed against Jack Colin Morris, #15855, an attorney licensed to practice law in Tennessee, alleging certain acts of misconduct. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, the Board of Professional Responsibility considered these matters at its meeting on December 9, 2016.

In 2010, Mr. Morris represented a client in post-conviction proceedings. When the post-conviction petition was denied, Mr. Morris was to pursue a direct appeal. However, Mr. Morris neglected to file a notice of appeal, and when his client inquired about the status of the matter, Mr. Morris misinformed him that the appellate court had not yet issued its opinion. In 2015, Mr. Morris advised his client that he had neglected to file the notice of appeal and sought permission to late-file. The Court of Criminal Appeals declined to waive the untimely notice of appeal.

By the aforementioned acts, Jack Colin Morris has violated Rule of Professional Conduct 1.3 (diligence), 1.4 (communication), 3.2 (expediting litigation), and 8.4(d) (conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice) and is hereby Publicly Censured for these violations.
