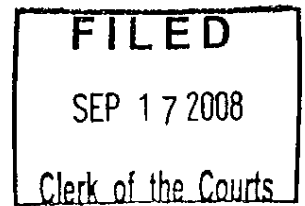

ORDER ON RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE

This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Reciprocal Discipline filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board") against Respondent, Kari M. Morton, on February 20, 2008, pursuant to Rule 9, § 17 of the Rules of the Supreme Court; upon a Notice issued by the Court on May 5, 2008, directing Respondent to inform the Court within thirty (30) days why the imposition of the identical discipline of a thirty (30) days suspension as ordered by the Supreme Court of Kentucky would be unwarranted in this state and the reasons therefor; and

It appearing to the Court that Respondent has failed to respond to the notice issued by the Court.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Respondent is hereby suspended from the practice of law for thirty (30) days.
2. Pursuant to Rule 9, § 24.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court, Respondent shall reimburse and pay to the Board the costs and expenses of this proceeding in the amount of \$253.00; and, in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue, if necessary.
3. The Board shall cause notice of this suspension to be published as required by Rule 9, § 18.10 of the Rules of the Supreme Court.
