**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon a petition to transfer Roy Patrick Neuenschwander to disability inactive status filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.3.

Upon due consideration of documentation from Mr. Neuenschwander's medical care provider submitted by Mr. Neuenschwander's attorney, the Court concludes that Roy Patrick Neuenschwander is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Roy Patrick Neuenschwander shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.

2. The Petition for Discipline proceedings, Docket No. 2015-2434-2-WM, Knox County Chancery Court Case No. 192374-1, and Docket No. 2016-2566-2-WM, are suspended indefinitely until such time as Mr. Neuenschwander is removed from disability inactive status.

3. Mr. Neuenschwander shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.

4. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.

5. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Neuenschwander's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
