ORDER OF ENFORCEMENT

This matter is before the Court upon a Petition for Discipline filed on April 7, 2010 by the Board of Professional Responsibility ("Board") against Clarence W. Phillips ("Respondent"); upon Response to Petition filed by Respondent on May 11, 2010; upon a Conditional Guilty Plea filed by Respondent on October 6, 2010; upon Order Recommending Approval of Conditional Guilty Plea entered by a Hearing Panel on October 12, 2010; upon approval by the Board on October 20, 2010; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which the Court approves the recommendation of the Hearing Panel and accepts the Conditional Guilty Plea.

It is therefore, ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED by the Court that:

- 1. Respondent, Clarence W. Phillips, shall be and is hereby suspended from the practice of law for sixty (60) days pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 4.2.
- 2. The suspension shall become effective ten (10) days after the filing of this Order.
- 3. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 24.3, the Respondent shall pay to the Board of Professional Responsibility the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$315.00, and in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, within thirty (30) days of the entry of this Order, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.

- 4. Respondent shall comply in all aspects with Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 18, regarding the obligations and responsibilities of suspended attorneys.
- 5. The Board shall cause notice of this suspension to be published as required by Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 18.10.
