AMENDED ORDER OF ENFORCEMENT

This matter is before the Court upon a certificate filed by Disciplinary Counsel for the Board of Professional Responsibility ("the Board") pursuant to Tenn. S. Ct. R. 9, Section 14, demonstrating that Darren J. Scoggins was involved in a serious crime; upon an Order entered on March 26, 2010, suspending Mr. Scoggins from the practice of law; upon a Petition for Final Discipline filed by the Board on May 20, 2010, against Mr. Scoggins; upon the Conditional Guilty Plea entered by Mr. Scoggins on July 26, 2011 and filed by the Board on August 3, 2011; upon the Order recommending the Conditional Guilty Plea entered by the Hearing Panel on August 15, 2011; upon the approval of the Board on September 9, 2011; and upon the entire record in this cause.

From all of which the Court approves the recommendation of the Hearing Panel and accepts the Conditional Guilty Plea.


It is therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Respondent, Darren J. Scoggins, shall be suspended for five (5) years pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 4.2.
2. The suspension shall become effective immediately upon Mr. Scoggins' release from prison.
3. Mr. Scoggins is hereby ordered to notify the Board immediately upon his release from prison.
4. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 24.3, Mr. Scoggins shall pay to the Board of Professional Responsibility the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$375.00 and in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, within thirty (30) days of the effective date of his suspension, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.

5. Mr. Scoggins shall comply in all aspects with Rule 9, Section 18 of the Rules of the Supreme Court regarding the obligations and responsibilities of suspended attorneys.

6. The Board shall cause notice of this suspension to be published as required by Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 18.10.
