PUBLIC CENSURE

The above complaint was filed against Alexander R. Starr, an attorney licensed to practice law in Michigan, alleging certain acts of misconduct. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, the Board of Professional Responsibility considered this matter at its meeting on December 13, 2024.

Mr. Starr applied for comity admission to practice law in Tennessee, and he received registration to practice pending admission under Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 7, §10.07. Mr. Starr then engaged in the active practice of law in at least six criminal cases in Henderson County for five months. Mr. Starr did not file motions for *pro hac vice* admission in the cases as required under Rule 7, §10.07.

By the aforementioned acts Alexander R. Starr is in violation of Rule of Professional Conduct 5.5 (unauthorized practice of law) and is hereby Publicly Censured for these violations.
