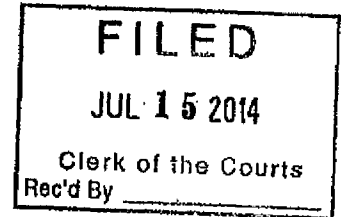

**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO  
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition for Transfer to Disability Inactive Status filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.3.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by Amar Bhatt, M.D., the Court concludes that Mary Ellen Stevens is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Mary Ellen Stevens shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.

2. Ms. Stevens shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.

3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.

4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Ms. Stevens's disability proceeding shall not be public record and shall be kept confidential.
