ORDER OF ENFORCEMENT

This cause is before the Court upon the Affidavit of Kevin Shalom Terry, of Nashville, Davidson County, an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Tennessee. Kevin Shalom Terry is subject to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Tennessee, pursuant to Rule 9 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Tennessee.

It appears to the Court that Kevin Shalom Terry has delivered to the Board of Professional Responsibility an Affidavit in compliance with Section 15.1 of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9. Kevin Shalom Terry has consented to disbarment because he cannot successfully defend himself on the charges alleged in Docket Petition No. 2011-2028-5-KB, which has been filed against him, and cannot successfully defend himself on the charges alleged in File Nos. 33750c-5-PS and 33775-5-PS, which have been authorized for the filing of a Supplemental Petition for Discipline by the Board of Professional Responsibility. It is conceded that Kevin Shalom Terry has violated Rules 5.5 and 8.4 of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED** and **DECREED** by the Court that:

1. Kevin Shalom Terry is hereby disbarred from the practice of law in Tennessee.
2. This Order of Enforcement shall be a matter of public record.
3. The affidavit filed by Kevin Shalom Terry shall not be publicly disclosed or made available for use in any other proceeding except upon further Order of this Court.
4. The Board of Professional Responsibility shall cause notice of this disbarment to be published in accordance with Section 18.5 of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9.

5. Kevin Shalom Terry shall comply with the requirements and obligations of disbarred attorneys as established in Section 18 of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9.
6. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Section 24.3, the Respondent shall pay to the Board of Professional Responsibility the expenses and costs of this matter in the amount of \$361.66 within ninety (90) days of the date of the entry of this Order, and in addition, shall pay to the Clerk of this Court the costs incurred herein, for all of which execution may issue if necessary.
7. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 9, Rules of the Supreme Court, Section 18.5, this Order shall be effective ten (10) days after the date of entry.
