ORDER

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition for Order of Enforcement filed by the Board of Professional Responsibility (the "Board") pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 14, a certificate filed by Disciplinary Counsel for the Board consisting of certified copies of the Indictment, Criminal Minutes, and Verdict Form in a criminal case, *United States of America v. John Oliver Threadgill*, (attached hereto as Collective Exhibit A), filed in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville on November 14, 2012, demonstrating that John O. Threadgill, a Tennessee attorney, has been found guilty of a serious crime, i.e., felony income tax evasion.

In consideration of the foregoing, and in consideration of the fact that this Court previously disbarred Mr. Threadgill by Order of Enforcement filed June 6, 2012 in Docket No. E2012-00263-SC-R3-BP, and again disbarred Mr. Threadgill by Order of Enforcement filed July 22, 2012 in Docket No. E2012-00263-SC-R3-BP, it is ORDERED that:

- 1. The Board's request that the Court summarily suspend Mr. Threadgill pending final disposition of a disciplinary proceeding is denied as unnecessary;
- 2. This matter is referred to the Board for the institution of a formal disciplinary proceeding in which the sole issue to be determined shall be the extent of the final discipline to be imposed as a result of the verdict of guilty;
- 3. Mr. Threadgill is required to comply with the provisions of Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §18 only to the extent that he has not already done so as a consequence of this Court's prior two

Orders of Enforcement filed June 6, 2012, and July 22, 2012; and

4. The Board need not provide any further notice pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 18.10.

The Grand Jury charges:

- 1. At various times relevant to this indictment, JOHN OLIVER THREADGILL, a resident of Knoxville, Tennessee, was an attorney engaged in the practice of law in the State of Tennessee.
- 2. That during each of the calendar years 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2004, JOHN OLIVER THREADGILL had taxable income upon which there was owing to the United States of America a substantial amount of income tax.
- 3. That well knowing and believing the foregoing facts, JOHN OLIVER THREADGILL, beginning on or about April 15, 1986, and continuing until on or about the date of this indictment, in the Eastern District of Tennessee, did willfully attempt to evade and

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defeat the payment of \$1,427,176 in income tax due to the United States for the 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2004 tax years, by failing to pay to the Internal Revenue Service said income tax, as required by law, and by committing the following affirmative acts of evasion, among other things:

- a. Using his law firm bank account and payroll account to issue checks to third parties for personal expenditures, thus disguising the existence and source of funds available to pay his assessed personal income taxes and thwarting attempts to collect such taxes;
- b. Creating and maintaining ledgers that concealed the true nature of personal expenditures from his law firm account;
- c. Establishing bank accounts in the names of nomince trusts and using such accounts to disguise the existence of assets, thus thwarting attempts to collect his personal income taxes; and
- d. Titling his personal residences in the names of nominee trusts in an attempt to disguise the ownership of such residences and place them beyond the reach of creditors, including the Internal Revenue Service.
- 4. That JOHN OLIVER THREADGILL engaged in the affirmative acts of evasion including, without limitation, those enumerated above, while making more than \$909,000 in personal expenditures, including the payment of more than \$69,000 for his daughter's wedding, the payment of more than \$245,000 for family educational expenses, the payment of more than

\$60,000 for country club expenses, the payment of more than \$52,000 for personal travel, and the payment of more than \$213,000 for personal real estate purchases.
