**MAURY COUNTY LAWYER PLACED ON DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

By Order of the Tennessee Supreme Court entered June 12, 2020, the law license of Angela Kay Washington was transferred to disability inactive status pursuant to Section 27.3 of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 9.

Ms. Washington cannot practice law while on disability inactive status. Attorneys placed on disability inactive status may return to the active practice of law upon the entry of an order by the Tennessee Supreme Court removing their disability and reinstating their license to active status.

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**ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO  
DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS**

This matter is before the Court upon a petition to transfer Angela Kay Washington to disability inactive status filed by the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.3.

Upon due consideration of documentation from Ms. Washington and her medical provider, the Court concludes that Angela Kay Washington is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

IT IS, THEREFORE, CONSIDERED, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT THAT:

1. The law license of Angela Kay Washington shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further order of the Supreme Court.
2. Ms. Washington shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 27.7.
3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, §§ 27.5 and 28.11.
4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 32.4, documents other than this Order relating to Ms. Washington's disability proceeding shall not be public records and shall be kept confidential.
