

ORDER TRANSFERRING ATTORNEY TO DISABILITY INACTIVE STATUS

This matter is before the Court upon the Petition for Order of Voluntary Disability Status filed by the Conservator of the Estate and Conservator of the Person of Joe Lee Wyatt, pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.2. The Board of Professional Responsibility (BPR) has filed a response indicating it has no objection to the transfer.

Upon due consideration of medical documentation submitted by Rada Petrinjac-Nenadic, M.D., the Court concludes that Joe Lee Wyatt is currently incapacitated from continuing the practice of law.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that:

- 1. The law license of Joe Lee Wyatt shall be transferred to disability inactive status for an indefinite period of time and until further orders of the Supreme Court.
- 2. Mr. Wyatt shall be allowed to petition for reinstatement to active status pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 21.6.
- 3. The Board shall publish notice of this transfer pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, $\S\S 21.4$ and 21.5.
- 4. Pursuant to Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 9, § 25.2, documents other than this Order relating to Mr. Wyatt's disability proceeding shall not be public record and shall be kept confidential.
